Although this huge set back, stalls were set up and food stalls started preparing the food.



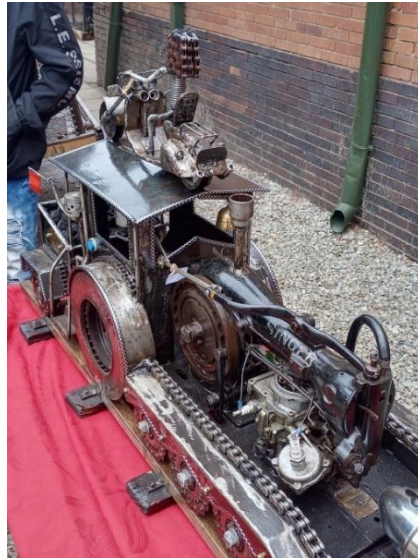
Lucky for everyone the pancake ladies, Stella, Sharon and Nicolette were on their post early and started with the selling of the pancakes.

## NEWS

### 40<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY – IPA SA



**The following extracts were taken from the keynote address by IPA SA President H (Vossie) Vos on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June 2022 at Timour Hall Villa, Cape Town.**

In brief about the history of IPA South Africa:

The Founding of IPA South Africa as one of currently 65 Sections commenced during 1979 through the initiative of an ex-member of IPA Zimbabwe (then Rhodesia) who immigrated to South Africa and who was a Reservist Lieutenant in the South African Police by the name of Roy Moore stationed in Cape Town

He had during 1979 and 1982 formally engaged with the Executive Management of the SA Police Service to have IPA formally established in South Africa

Although Roy Moore from historical research is regarded as the Founder of IPA South Africa, other key individuals such as Paul Bjoet (Netherlands Section, Uli Gehring and others fulfilled a critical role in the Founding of IPA South Africa

The role and initiatives of Uli Gehring is significant. Uli, then Captain in the SA Police Service, and who at that time was an Associated member of Section Germany had from his side also engaged with the Executive Management of the SA Police Service to have the IPA established – interesting enough is that his communication as with Roy Moore was with a certain Brigadier Grobbelaar – but the two individuals undertook the unknowingly from each other

On 28 March 1982 the then Minister of Police, approved the establishment of the IPA in South Africa

Following the Ministerial approval, the Interim Committee of IPA South Africa was formed on 16 June 1982 and comprised of

- TH Sherman
- VB van Boom
- Roy Moore

At the 10<sup>th</sup> IPA World Congress held in Wiesbaden, Germany during 1982, IPA South Africa was officially adopted as an IPA Section with effect of 16 June 1982.

On 23 July 1982 the first official National Council Meeting of IPA South Africa took place and with 31 members in attendance, the first National Executive Committee was elected and comprised of:-

- President – General MCW Geldenhuys
- CEO – Maj. Genl. HV Verster
- Vice President Administrative – Brig. JB Stevens
- Vice President Financial – Capt. (F) D. Engelbrecht
- Vice President Travel and Cultural – R/Capt. Roy Moore
- Vice President Editor – Maj. DS Lambrechts

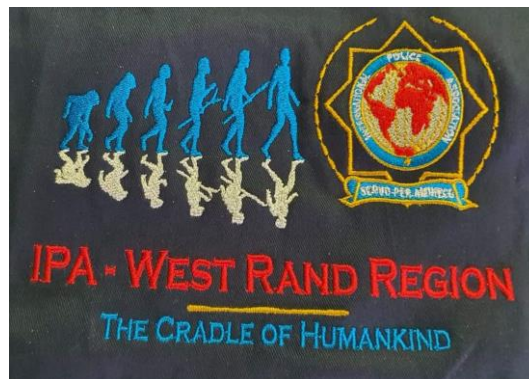
