Louis also introduced his "Chicken Box" where 4 large chickens were placed in a box and perfectly cooked as alternative meat dish for the evening.



#### SENIORS SHOEBOX PROJECT



This foundation is also feeding up to **320 children**, every day, Monday to Fridays – 3 meals a day! All from a normal suburban house in Krugersdorp West, in a small kitchen on a six-burner gas stove.







They also launched a Seniors Shoebox Project where they asked the community to sponsor an elderly person and fill a shoe box with necessities and treats. They provided a list of basic- and treat items which must be placed in the shoe box.






### SCHOOL BAG PROJECT


I sincerely hope that I made a difference in someone's live or just allowing someone to receive love and happiness.
